

A brief report on progress at the Children's Home at Mahoma Makulu.

At the Home the staff and children are daily celebrating the availability of clean water. So are the people from the adjacent village. The previous long trek to find potable water is now replaced by a short walk.



I visited the Home the first week of March. I found the manager, Young Ben, in the tomato patch. They are very pleased with the developments and greatly encouraged.

Many of the children are in the care of Guardian Parents in Dodoma. This system works so very well. They come to the Home on school holidays. Some of the older young people, attending a local secondary school, live at the Home, which they have named 'Our Home'. Now some of the Guardian Parents come to the Home to help with developments, and also to develop a garden where they can grow some

vegetables for use in their own homes, as they care for the children. I met these three hard working 'parents' when I visited there.

The three young fellows working with hoes in a new garden area live at the home. I was informed that they



are up and busy before anyone else at the Home. They are pleased to have a place they can call 'Home', and inspired by the development they see taking place. I was inspired through spending these few hours with them.

They hold in their hearts a vision of life transformed. Once they were small lads, begging on the streets of

Dodoma! Now they have a life where they can begin to provide for themselves. I can easily foresee that day. If you have had a part in this wonderful gift of renewed life we thank you and pray God's continued blessings upon you. Finally, here is the Home building as it now appears, surrounded by a vegetable garden.
